As the Database and Information Systems Group, we work on database technology for modern computing hardware. In particular, we investigate

- database algorithms optimized for cache and main memory efficiency,
- how parallelism and distribution (e.g., in cloud-based systems) can be leveraged for database tasks, and
- the use of non-standard architectures (GPUs, FPGAs, ...) in a database context.

We build systems to demonstrate our results in realistic settings. The group enjoys international visibility in the field

The Databases and Information Systems Group is part of the Collaborative Research Center SFB 876 at TU Dortmund.

We are also engaged in teaching database topics at TU Dortmund. Whenever possible, we combine teaching with our own research work.

Job Description

We are looking for active, motivated, and talented researchers to join our group. Candidates are expected to hold a Master's degree in Computer Science, be interested systems-level work, and like to contribute to research and education as done by the group. Experience (at least strong interest) in one of the above research topics is a plus.

We expect you to be solid in the English language. German language skills are not a requirement. You will be working in the context of the SFB 876 research center.
